**Isaiah 66:10-14c**

**Luke 10:1-12, 17-20**



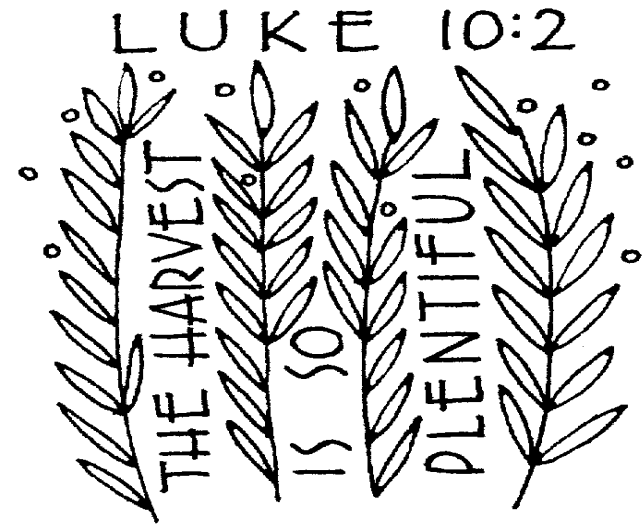
**KEY VERSE:** "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few" (v 2).

**READING:** Jesus sent forth seventy-two disciples to prepare the soil for the abundant harvest that was to come. The number seventy was symbolic to the Jews. It was the number of elders who were chosen to help Moses leading the people in the wilderness (Nm 11:16-17). It was also the number of the Sanhedrin, the supreme council of the Jews. And it was thought that there were seventy nations in the world. Since Luke was a Gentile, it may well be that he looked forward to the day when every nation would know the Lord. The seventy-two followers of Christ represented him in every home they entered. Jesus warned his disciples that they would be like helpless sheep exposed to prey. They must depend entirely upon God's providence and protection. Yet, as God's messengers, they deserved the support of those who benefited from their proclamation of God's reign. The disciples were to warn those who rejected the call to repent that divine judgment was at hand. The seventy-two returned from their mission jubilant because of their power over the forces of evil. Jesus told them that they should rejoice more in the fact that they belonged to God.

**REFLECTING:** Do I give prayer and financial support to those who proclaim the Gospel?

**PRAYING:** Lord Jesus, help me to respond to your Word with faith.

**Theme: Jesus is asking for more workers to build His Church**

The prophet Isaiah offered consolation to a people weary of being in exile. All those who mourned over the destruction of Jerusalem would one day be comforted, as a mother comforts her child, holding it tenderly in her lap. Then they would know that the Lord was with them in their grief.

Jesus sent His disciples to announce the good news that God's reign had arrived in their midst. They must travel lightly and announce Christ's peace to all who would listen. Jesus knew that the road ahead would be difficult and that His disciples would meet opposition. Not everyone heard the message they proclaimed. There were many who opposed the gospel of grace and mercy. Jesus' disciples had to learn to trust God and one another every step of the journey.

Paul declared that there is nothing we can do to earn God's reign. Instead of looking at our own merits, he points us to the cross. When our suffering is united to Christ's suffering, darkness and evil are defeated. Mourning days are over and it becomes of time of rejoicing. But to convey this message, Jesus needs workers out in the field. Each of us has been called to continue His work. If we let others do our jobs, then faith become complacent and His Church suffers. When a parish closes, it is not the fault of God, it is the lack of those who were called, and not doing what is expected. We should not allow others to do our work but be involved in continuing the Mission handed to us. We must place our faith priorities straight.
