



OCTAVE OF CORPUS CHRISTI

Genesis 14:18-20
Psalm 110
1 Corinthians 11:23-26
Luke 9:11b-17

KEY VERSE: "They all ate until they had enough" (v.17).

READING: When Jesus sent his disciples out to proclaim the reign of God, he told them to "take nothing for the journey" (Lk.9:3). Just as Israel had to learn to depend on God for their daily needs, Jesus' disciples must trust in God's providence. As a parable in action, Jesus multiplied the bread in the wilderness and fed the multitude. Jesus' four Eucharistic acts sum up every aspect of his life. Just as he takes, blesses, breaks, and shares the bread with the people, Jesus takes God's revelation, blesses it by his words and deeds, offers his body and blood on the cross, and shares God's life with the world. Jesus is our daily bread, our nourishment on our journey to God's kingdom. His precious blood sacrificed on our behalf gives us everlasting life.

REFLECTING: In what ways does our parish care for the hungry poor?

PRAYING: Lord Jesus, fill me with your life-giving food so that I may feed others.

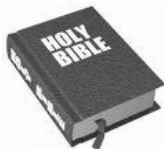

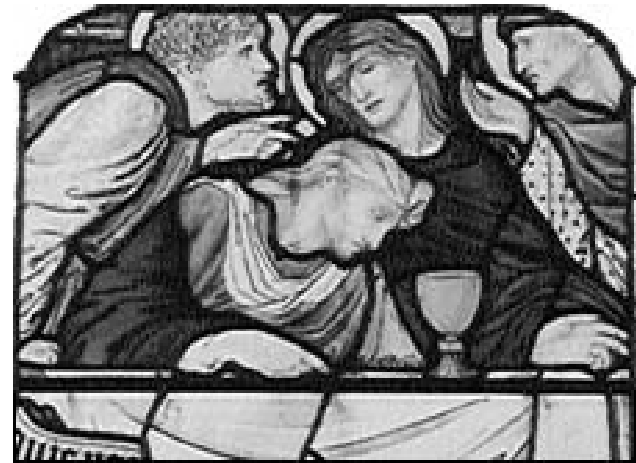

Theme: The Body of Christ

Today, we continue with the theme of the Body of Christ. Finding ourselves within the Octave, we reflect upon the importance of the Eucharist. The Eucharist is God’s supreme gift to us. This gift is the source of life and hope for all of God’s people who hunger for it.

Christ’s teaching by the lakeside was sublime; but it did not prevent Him from being aware of the very ordinary needs of the hearers-they were tired and they were hungry. He made use of what was at hand and fed them. He took the small amount of bread and the two fish and gave them for distribution to the large crowd that waited. “And they ate and were satisfied.

At the Last Supper, Jesus took bread and wine, blessed it and said, “This is my body which is for you; this cup is the covenant in my blood.” In the Eucharist, we are united with Christ. He gives Himself to us and we give ourselves to Him. We receive His life and strength because we need it, as the people by the lakeside needed food.

If we fulfill our call as National Catholics, we go out to others and give Christ’s love to them. Like Jesus, we have to be close enough to them to recognize their real needs. We have to waste nothing of the gifts of God given us. Nothing is wasted in that miracle by the lake. God’s gifts to us are meant to be used. We must do this to build our Church Family. If we do not follow our Lord’s directive, we will surely cease to be present in the future years to come.
