SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

(Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11; Psalm 85; 2 Peter 3: 8-14); Mark 1:1-8

KEY VERSE: "Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way" (v 2).

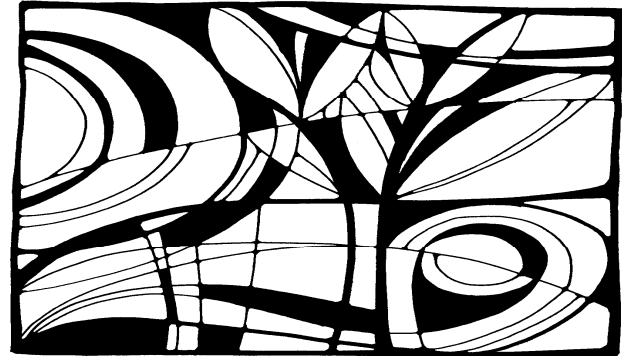
READING: John the Baptist announced the good news that the Messiah, the Christ (Greek, Christos, the "anointed one"), the Son of God, was coming to save his people. John was the "new Elijah" who prepared the people for the arrival of the "Day of the Lord" (Mal 3:1, 23). Like Elijah, John appeared in the desert proclaiming a message of repentance. John realized that his role was that of a lowly herald of the glad tidings; he himself was not the message. John was a humble servant unworthy to untie the sandals of his master. His baptism of water was for the forgiveness of sins. Jesus was "one more powerful" who would come after him to baptize with the purifying grace of the Holy Spirit.

REFLECTING: Am I a willing servant to God's people, or do I want others to serve me?

PRAYING: Lord Jesus, help me to proclaim the glad tidings of your coming.

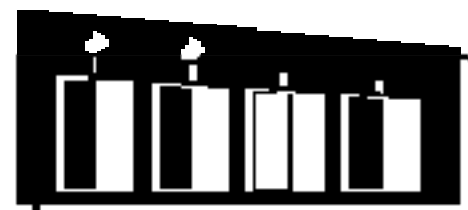
THEME: What will I feel when the Lord comes?

Waiting for good news or bad news can fill us with joy for dread. One day may seem like a thousand years. When we forget God's faithfulness, we need to be assured that God's promises can be fulfilled, perhaps not by our watches and calendars but with guaranteed fidelity. We need to comfort others when they fail to remember: "Here is your God; the Lord comes with might to save us!"

John announces the good news: "Make straight the way of the Lord!" John is God's mighty voice, yet Jesus' words are more powerful. John stresses judgment, whereas Jesus speaks of salvation: "Kindness and truth shall meet; justice and peace shall kiss." The mountains in our lives will be overcome; the wastelands will flourish in the grace of the Holy Spirit. God is a loving shepherd who shows generous patience towards us when we wander. We need to patiently wait in hope as we pray: "Lord, let us see Your kindness, and grant us Your salvation."
