

SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Acts 1:15-17, 20a, 20c-26; Psalm 103;
1 John 4:11-16; John 17:11-19

KEY VERSE: "Holy Father, keep them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one just as we are" (v 11b).

READING: On the threshold of his eternal glory in heaven, Jesus prayed an intimate prayer to his Father. It was his final prayer before his passion and death. The Church calls it the "high priestly prayer" as Jesus interceded on behalf of his "friends" (Jn 15:14). Just as Jacob and Moses gave a last benediction to the Twelve Tribes of Israel (Gn 49; Dt 33), so too, Jesus blessed the Twelve Apostles, the new people of God. Jesus completed the work assigned to him by making God known to his followers. As the Father sent Jesus into the world, Jesus sent his disciples into the world. The Apostles were "consecrated" for this work, that is, they were set apart and made holy. Yet they were not removed from the world, but must do Christ's work in the world. God commanded the people of Israel to be holy as God holiness (Lv 19:2). God's holy people in the Church are a means of sanctification for the entire world.

REFLECTING: Do I radiate God's holiness to others?

PRAYING: Risen Lord, protect me from evil as I do your work in the world.

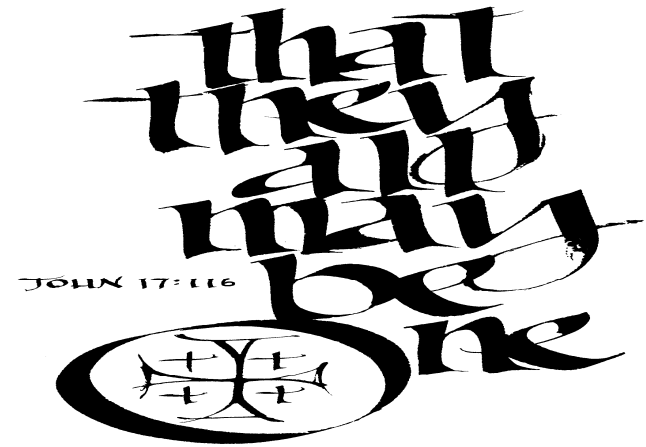

THEME: Do I reveal God’s truth of unity?

As Jesus is about to ascend and sit at the right hand of the Father, He prays that God will bless His followers and make them holy in the same way as He was consecrated by means of truth. Jesus reveals that the human and divine dwells as one. He prays that unity remains in His disciples. As a Good Shepherd would do, Jesus keeps a watchful eye over His flock. He prays that evil will not prevail against them. What Jesus wants is that the disciples He leaves behind remain in the trust and faith in all that they learned. He commissions them to go forth and tell about the loving and saving powers of the Holy Trinity.

We have been given the same commission. The Church did not stop with the Apostles, but it continues to the present. The living Church worships the living God as it waits until the great day when Jesus returns.

We will hear how many people flocked to the Church when they heard the Good News told them by the Apostles. The same can be true today. In our world of sin and sadness, false hope is given to bandage the wounds. But we want the wounds to be healed, so what do we do? Return back to God wholeheartedly. We should not just go through the motions but truly believe. Jesus did not say, ‘seek first the kingdom of God and all things shall be added to you’ because it sounded nice. He said it as a divine truth and path that all must follow. And we must do this in love and unity. A house divided will not stand, but a house united will expand to our wildest imaginations because Jesus said so.
