32nd Sunday Ordinary Time

First Reading: 2 Maccabees 7: 1-2, 9-14

Responsorial Psalm: 17

Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 2: 16-3:5

Gospel: Luke 20: 27-38



KEY VERSE: “He is God, not of the dead, but of the living.”

Luke 20: 38

READINGS: Our first reading tell the story of martyrdom of a mother and her seven sons. They drew their strength and their hope from their faith in the resurrection of the just. Paul prays in our second reading for the Thessalonians that God will comfort and strength them so that they may remain steadfast in the pursuit of goodness. The Sadducees in the Gospel did not believe in an afterlife, asked Jesus a question. The aim of the question was to ridicule the idea of bodily resurrection from the dead.

REFLECTING: It is incidental that this passage of the Gospel is normally read near to the beginning of November, when we have celebrated the feasts of All Saints and All Souls, since it is a strong proclamation of the reality of life after death and the resurrection of the body. This Sunday is not without its difficulties, however, since this message is framed in two very sensitive passages: we have a story of cruelty and martyrdom in the first reading, and a controversial (and possibly upsetting) question about marriage in the Gospel. Remember that the example that the Sadducees bring is ridiculous, legalistic and completely misses the point: Jesus’ reply does not mean that we are not with our loved ones after death - quite the contrary, He proclaims that we will all become one with God and each other as children of God.

PRAYING: Heavenly Father, Your only begotten Son overcame death and gave us the hope of eternal life. Grant that all who believe in Him may triumph over death and come to share in His glory. We ask this through the same Christ.
