We are getting close to our goal in paying off our loan. We have less than \$10,000.00 in payment. Help us by paying off this loan by the end of the year.

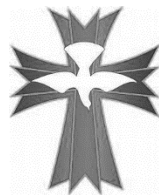


International Village

13 Sunday Ordinary Time

First Reading: Wisdom 1: 13-15; 2:23-24

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 30

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 8:7,9,13-15

Gospel: Mark 5: 21-43



Key Verses: "Little girl, I tell you to get up!"

Mark 5: 41

READINGS: Our first reading we are reminded that God does not rejoice in the destruction of the living. Rather God formed human beings to be imperishable and if we live the commandments we will live forever. Paul reminds us that Christians should be generous to others in imitation of the sovereign liberality of Christ who gave His life for our salvation. In today's Gospel, we have the healing effect of Jesus which prefigured into His victory over the death of alienation from God. Jesus comes to bring new life and restore our relationship of love with God.

REFLECTING: Today we are invited to marvel at one of the most dramatic and amazing of the Lord's miracles, the raising back to life of the daughter of Jairus. The story is told with a level of emotional realism: the calm faith but dreadful fear of Jairus, the servants who bring the news of his daughter's death, the calm reassurance of Jesus and even the laughter of the servant who mock Jesus, all these make this a story that can engage us and speak to us. And what it says is something profound: all the miracles of the Lord proclaim the Kingdom of God, the world the way God wants it to be. God does not want us to die: death is not part of God's plan for us. This is reinforced by the unfamiliar first reading from the book of Wisdom, which opens our listening to God's Word today with the dramatic phrase: Death was not God's doing. God created us to live forever, and the raising of Jairus' daughter to life is a vivid and outstanding proclamation of this truth.

PRAYER: God, You chose us to be children. May we always listen to Your words and in deeds live our lives accordingly to Your expectations. This we pray through Christ our Lord.
