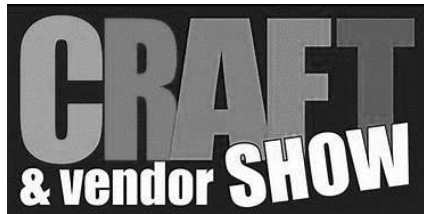
## **September is Spojnia Month**

### Why Attend School of Christian Living?

Parents, this is why you send your child to SOCL. Religious education is important because it equips students with cultural, social, moral and spiritual knowledge that aids in mental and physical development within society. The lessons learned in religious education prepare students for responsibilities, experiences and opportunities later in life. Religious education assists students in forming values and beliefs that are reflected in behaviors and communication. For example, when approached with an ethical or moral dilemma, people with religious education can reflect on the teachings of the church to make a decision that is in line with their values and beliefs. Religious education is also important because the information prompts people to challenge ideas and questions about their purpose in life, their beliefs about God and what it means to co-exist with others in a peaceful environment. The knowledge offers guidance for how to behave in line with religious traditions and world views of the church, and often prompts people to put others before themselves and give back to the community through financial, physical and social support. Religious education teaches students about the history of the world through the eyes of Christianity, and encourages them to acknowledge and understand different values, traditions and religious beliefs that exist within various cultures. Many times, religious education also prompts people to evaluate issues of truth, ethics and faith within their personal lives. ## 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

**First Reading:** Deuteronomy 4: 1-2, 6-8

**Responsorial:** Psalm 15

**Second Reading:** James 1: 17-18, 21b-22, 27

**Gospel:** Mark 7: 1-8, 14-15, 21-23



**KEY VERSE:** "You put aside the commandment of God to cling to human traditions."  
Mark 7:8

**READINGS:** Moses once again urges the people to be faithful to God's law. It is not a burden to be endured, but a source of life and wisdom. James says that it is not enough to listen to the word of God. We must put it into practice. He offers some concrete examples of what he means. The passage in the Gospel contains a clash between Christ and the Pharisees. Christ tells them they have substituted their own law for the law of God, with the result that their worship of God has become mere lip service.

**REFLECTION:** The Gospel brings out one of the central problems of all religion: the way in which peripheral laws and customs gradually take over the more fundamental commandments, and the way in which "externalism" and a concern with superficialities gradually suffocates a true "internal" faith which is lived out. Here we see the angry Jesus: he calls them "hypocrites", as he condemns their "worthless worship". He teaches a central truth: it is what comes from within that determines whether we are clean or unclean, good or evil. The commandments of God, which Moses puts before the people with such great pride, become the source of justice when they are given a place in the heart. When other rules and regulations about how to wash and what to eat displace them, then they are stifled, and justice is practiced no longer.

**PRAYER:** Heavenly Father, as I continue in my faith, may it always be sincere and from the heart, for that is the only worship that truly honors You, Jesus and the Holy Spirit.
