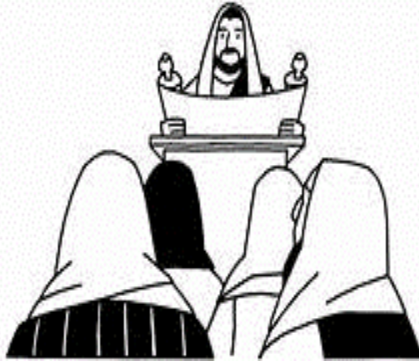

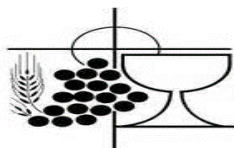

Discipleship

When Jesus speaks, we listen. That makes sense, right? Jesus is the one to whom all authority in heaven and earth has been given (Matthew 28:18). Jesus is the one of whom it will be said, forever, “Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!” (Revelation 5:12). He’s the one to whom every knee will bow (Philippians 2:10) — the one on account of whom all the tribes of the earth will wail (Revelation 1:7), and from whom the fury of God’s wrath will be executed (Revelation 19:15).

Jesus has *that* kind of supremacy — so what he says matters. And beyond that, we’ve been united to Jesus by faith (Romans 6:5), made alive in him by grace (Ephesians 2:4–5), counted righteous in him because of his work (Galatians 2:16). Jesus, in all of his supremacy, is also our shepherd — so we know his voice (John 10:27).

Therefore, by virtue of his power and grace, because he is *the* Sovereign and *our* Savior, when he tells his church to make disciples of all nations, *we really want to do that*. Jesus commissions us to “go” — because of his authority — “and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you” (Matthew 28: 19-20).

3rd Sunday Ordinary Time

First Reading: Neh.8: 2-4, 5-6, 8-10

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 19

Second Reading: 1Corinthians 12: 12-30

Gospel: Luke 1: 1-4; 4: 14-21



KEY VERSE: "The text is being fulfilled today." Luke 4: 21

READINGS: In the first reading the people of God return to their homeland, rebuild the temple and now listen to the proclamation of the law of God. Paul reminds us that by baptism we become Christians. Christ takes possession of us and we must grow with Him. The Gospel has us hearing Jesus proclaiming the “good news” to the poor and announcing the fulfillment of the prophetic vision of Isaiah of the Messiah.

REFLECTING: Today is about beginnings: the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. It begins with the Word of God, in the synagogue. Jesus reads from the Old Testament, as we do every Sunday, and tells the people that it is fulfilled in him. Everything that God has said to his people, through his prophets, comes together in Jesus, the Incarnate Word of God. Today is an ideal Sunday to think about the ministry of lector - about how as lectors we make present the same fulfillment, Jesus, when we read the Word of God in our parish.

PRAYING: Lord, you gave to me the Body of Christ, the Church. Through my baptism I have become a member of Your Church with special spiritual gifts. Show me my gift so I can continue to build Your Church and help bring Your saving plan to all people as a true disciple.
