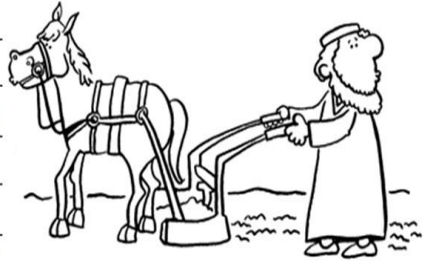

First Reading: 1 Kings 19: 16b, 19-21

Responsorial: 16

Second Reading: Galatians 5: 1, 13-18

Gospel: Luke 9:51-62

KEY VERSES: “No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God.” Luke 9: 62

READINGS: In the first Elisha left family and flocks to follow the prophet Elijah. This foreshadows the apostles who will leave home, family and business to follow Christ. One of the primary desires of Paul in his letter to the Galatians is that we should love one another. He warns that Christian communities that have jealousies, disputes and personal preference will come to ruin. Jesus commands total commitment from His followers and gives the signs by which the true follower of Christ can be known.

REFLECTING: There is a sense of urgency about discipleship – almost like emergency services responding to a crisis, in the Gospel today there is no time to wait for any normal human moments, no reason to delay: the hand must be placed immediately on the plow, the work must begin NOW! It can feel as though Jesus is being a little abrupt in this passage – even a little too intense! But it is a question of priorities: for the Lord, the work of salvation, or proclaiming the Gospel, brooks no delay. Perhaps this intensity is a valuable reminder for us – we can tend to “tame” Jesus, and forget that he was passionately and totally dedicated to the Mission his heavenly Father had entrusted to him – even to the point that he left Nazareth to become a homeless preacher with nowhere to lay his head.

PRAYING: Heavenly Father, I have been called to be Your disciple. Guide me towards becoming Your true servant. This I pray through Your Son Jesus in unity with the Holy Spirit.
