16th SUNDAY ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Genesis 18: 1-10a

Responsorial: 15

Second Reading: Colossians 1: 24-28

Gospel: Luke 10: 38-42



KEY VERSE: “but few things are needed—or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her.”
Luke 10: 42

READINGS: When Abraham gave hospitality to three strangers in our first reading, he did not know that he was entertaining God Himself. The strangers reward him with the good news that his wife is to bear him a child. Paul wrote to the Colossians that he suffers for his converts. He is a minister of “that mystery hidden for generations,” namely, the calling of the Gentiles to salvation. In the Gospel we see two sisters, Martha and Mary. They welcome Jesus into their home in Bethany, though each does so in a different way.

REFLECTING: Sacred Hospitality is our theme: as the letter to the Hebrews says: “remember always to welcome strangers, for by doing this some people have entertained angels without knowing it.” True hospitality lies in two things: first the welcome, encouraging the stranger to enter the house and be at home there: secondly, the gift - not just of food or drink, but of time: listening to the stranger, and giving of ourselves to them. This is what makes hospitality costly, but holy, and a true service of Jesus Christ.

PRAYING: Merciful Father, when we come to celebrate the Eucharist, we are sometimes told that we should leave behind us our cares and concerns and lay them at the feet of Christ. Give us the faith to trust Your ways. This we pray through the same Jesus Christ who lives and reigns with You the Father and the Holy Spirit.
