Discipleship

When Jesus speaks, we listen. That makes sense, right? Jesus is the one to whom all authority in heaven and earth has been given (Matthew 28:18). Jesus is the one of whom it will be said, forever, “Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!” (Revelation 5:12). He’s the one to whom every knee will bow (Philippians 2:10) — the one on account of whom all the tribes of the earth will wail (Revelation 1:7), and from whom the fury of God’s wrath will be executed (Revelation 19:15).

Jesus has *that* kind of supremacy — so what he says matters. And beyond that, we’ve been united to Jesus by faith (Romans 6:5), made alive in him by grace (Ephesians 2:4–5), counted righteous in him because of his work (Galatians 2:16). Jesus, in all of his supremacy, is also our shepherd — so we know his voice (John 10:27).

Therefore, by virtue of his power and grace, because he is *the* Sovereign and *our* Savior, when he tells his church to make disciples of all nations, *we really want to do that*. Jesus commissions us to “go” — because of his authority — “and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you” (Matthew 28: 19-20).

2nd Sunday Ordinary Time

First Reading: Isaiah 62: 1-5

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 96

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12: 4-11

Gospel: John 2: 1-12



KEY VERSE: "This was the first of the signs given by Jesus; it was given at Cana in Galilee." John 2: 11

READING: In the first reading from Isaiah, he wrote that Zion, Jerusalem, stands for the Israelite people, desolate and exiled. But God loves Zion and rejoices in her restoration. Paul writes in our second reading that God gives His Spirit in different ways to different people. He has different ways of showing His love. Our Gospel reveals Jesus' first miracle when He turns water in wine at the wedding feast. Only with His help can our love be transformed into a deeper and more Christ-like love.

REFLECTING: The Gospel of this second Sunday of Ordinary Time continues the theme of the end of Christmas - revelation. Jesus is revealed to the world by his birth, by his baptism, and by his miracles - the "signs" as John calls them. The wedding in today's Gospel is interpreted in many ways: today, reading the Gospel with the First Reading in mind, we can see it as an image of the way in which God is so close to his people, it is as though He is married to them. Thus Jesus, the spouse of the people, shows God's closeness by revealing His glory in this miracle.

PRAYING: Father, lead us to our Cana which is today's Mass, for we thirst. May ask this through Him who invites us now to partake of His Body and Blood.
