14 SUNDAY ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 66: 10-14

Responsorial: 66

Second Reading: Galatians 6: 14-18

Gospel: Luke 10: 1-12, 17-20



KEY VERSE: “The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few”.

Luke 10: 2

READINGS: The first reading is a hymn to celebrate the blessings that the Lord would shower upon Jerusalem. We know now that what the prophet was referring to be the reign of Christ, the new Jerusalem. We are reminded in the 2nd reading that the Old Law has ended and no longer binds since Christ has built a new world which all people are invited to join. The Gospel tells of the commissioning of His disciples preparing His way by preaching His message. Preaching the Gospel is not easy a task because we must depart from the values of the world and devote ourselves to God words.

REFLECTING: The link between the First Reading and Gospel is not immediately apparent today, until you look at the “headings” which are always chosen “to make the connection between readings of the same Mass clear. The “headings” present us with a simple picture today: a river of peace flowing out from the Lord, which we see in the Gospel as the flowing of the disciples as they are sent out on their first mission. From the Lord of Peace, others, like ripples in a pool, flow out carrying his simple message: “Peace to this house!”

PRAYING: Heavenly Father, the Church of Christ is the New Jerusalem of which the prophets foretold. Give us the strength to spread that Church. We pray through Jesus Christ our Lord.

“Peace I leave you; My peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do, I give it to you.” **John 14: 27**
