21ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 66: 18-21

Responsorial Psalm: 117

Second Reading: Hebrews 12: 5-7, 11-13

Gospel: Luke 13: 22-30



KEY VERSE: “Men from east and west will come to take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God.”
Luke 13: 29

READINGS: In the first reading the author describes the Jews making their way back from the ends of the earth to worship in the restored city of Jerusalem. With them they bring non-Jews, who join them in worshipping one God. The Letter to the Hebrews in our second reading speaks of as a father shows his concern for his son and daughter by seeing to it that they receive training in discipline, so God trains His children through suffering so that they may grow to maturity and reach their goal. Jesus in the Gospel speaks of the Kingdom of God is offered not just to the Jews but to people from the four corners of the world. However, only those who follow the path of Jesus will gain access to it.

REFLECTING: It's probably a nightmare we all share to some degree or other - being locked out of the house, the car, the sales, the big match, or missing the train, the boat or plane. Contemplating watching the crowds that have got inside, while we can do nothing, can be unnerving. Complacency can leave us in this situation: today the Lord warns all who listen to him to be careful, taking nothing for granted, but making sure that we are (spiritually at least) like the people waiting with their sleeping bags and thermos flasks by the front door of the ticket office.

PRAYING: Merciful Father, fill our hearts with Your love and keep us faithful to the Gospel of Christ. Give us the grace to rise above our human weaknesses. Grant this through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, Who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.
