Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged and sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his servants, 'The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come. Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find.' The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests. But when the king came in to meet the guests, he saw a man there not dressed in a wedding garment. The king said to him, 'My friend, how is it that you came in here without a wedding garment?' But he was reduced to silence. Then the king said to his attendants, 'Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth.' FAITH SHARING

<u>In the first reading</u>, Isaiah describes the Messianic banquet on the Lord's mountain in the Holy City of Jerusalem, which Yahweh is preparing for His people. Yahweh invites all people, including Gentiles, to the banquet.

<u>In the second reading</u>, St. Paul advises the Philippians to put their trust in the power and goodness of a providing God, Who, in Jesus, has given His Church everything His followers will need to participate in the Heavenly Banquet.


<u>In today's Gospel</u>, by telling an allegorical parable of judgment in the Temple of Jerusalem two days before his arrest, Jesus accuses the Jewish religious and civil leaders of rejecting God's invitation to the Heavenly Banquet given to them through God's Own Son, Himself. They have rejected the invitation by not listening to the Good News preached by Jesus and by not reforming their lives. Hence, God is inviting the sinners and Gentiles to His banquet, and that is why Jesus is keeping the company of sinners.

During the church service, the ushers usually take part in some way. They are responsible to take up the church offering and also help congregation during Communion.



In case of an emergency, the ushers will take the lead in getting people to safety in an orderly manner. After the service, ushers will again be at the door to greet the congregation as they leave and provide assistance as needed. They will then make sure that the sanctuary is tidy, the thermostat is adjusted, and the lights and candles are shut off.

Ushers in church aren't just door holders and plate-passers. They serve in a spiritual role. A church usher is a person who helps ensure a smoothly running church service and who ministers to people in a variety of practical ways.
