28th Sunday Ordinary Time Solemnity-Christian Family

First Reading: Wisdom 7: 7-11
Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 90
Second Reading: Hebrews 4: 12-13
Gospel: Mark 10: 17-30



Key Phrase: "Go and sell everything you own and follow me."
Mark 10: 21

Readings: Our first reading is a prayer for the wisdom which is the very radiance of god's glory, while our second reading seems like a hymn to the living, the active Word of God constitutes today's liturgy Solemnity of the Christian Family. Our Gospel gives the classic statement of the degree which Christians are to follow, which is nothing less than total dedication.

Reflection: In today's story of the rich young man, who comes to Jesus full of good intentions, there are some simple words that speak so clearly to our own age: when Jesus tells him to sell everything and give it to the poor, his face fell at these words, and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth. How sad it is that such a keen (he runs up to Jesus), and by all accounts good young man (whom Jesus loves) could not free himself from the one thing that was holding him back his dependence on money. Jesus words "How hard it is..." perhaps indicate his own sadness that the young man could not free himself from this. Jesus' teaching was new - as the disciples' reaction shows. In Israel at the time, riches were thought to be a blessing from God. But as Jesus knew and taught, holding on to anything that passes away can distract us from holding on to things that are eternal.

Praying: Heavenly Father, we pray for the wisdom of Christ and for our families which renews our lives day by day. May we always be faithful the Christ our Lord who lives and reigns forever and ever.
