The Word This Week

There is no room in a good field for weeds and rubbish: so, in the Kingdom of Heaven, there is no room for all things that provoke offences, and all who do evil. They must be got rid of, for the sake of the good wheat, for the sake of the good subjects of the kingdom. But this weeding out will not take place until harvest time - in case one piece of good wheat is destroyed with the weeds. This shows the mercy of God: everyone has chance after chance to prove that they are wheat, not weeds; there are no quick judgements in the kingdom of heaven, and things are never as black and white as we think. Only at the end of time will evil stand out clearly, so that it can be disposed of, and only the Son of Man can judge.

In our second reading this morning, we have two simple verses of Paul's letter, but it contains so much! One of the problems we often face in our lives as Christians is an inability to pray: we know what we want to say, but somehow, we cannot express that thought in any way. Many of us know this feeling. Today, we want

an answer to that problem, so let us listen with the conviction that what we are saying is useful and relevant. It is all about surrender to the Spirit who expresses our pleas. The content of this reading is so simple and comforting that it should present no problems as long as we are aware of the wonderful nature of the gift that is being offered in this reading and allow that gift to be perceived and taken by the listening assembly present.

Let them both grow till the harvest.
